Religious Services

- 1. Most religions are represented in major areas of the United States.
- Your IMSO will be able to tell you where the nearest house of worship for your religion is located.
- 3. Your training schedule usually does not allow for religious observances, such as prayer times, or days off.
- 4. With the large number of international military students in US training programs, it is not feasible to accommodate all religions.
- 5. Your country has selected two one-day holidays per year that you may celebrate in addition to U.S. holidays
 - This is contingent upon it not interfering with critical scheduled training or testing.

Smoking

- 1. On US military installations and throughout American society, there are significant restrictions and limitations on smoking.
- 2. Generally, smoking in enclosed public places such as office buildings, restaurants, shopping malls, and transportation terminals is prohibited.
 - Some communities are now passing laws that prohibit smoking in taverns and bars.
- 3. If you do smoke, there will be a designated smoking area that you can use at your training installation.
 - Be aware that the location will normally be outside and well away from building entrances.
- 4. Allow yourself enough time to have your cigarette and get back to class in time for the start of your lesson.
